# What is the Discharge Summary Web Guide?

The Discharge Summary Web Guide (DSWG) aims to provide a smartphone-friendly Discharge Summary Template as an aid for Providers to include the necessary patient visit information within the Discharge Summary. The intent is to ensure that the documentation is consistently and accurately completed to communicate critical patient care information for continuity of care, program planning, research and funding. The discharge summary is a primary document that is utilized by HIM Coding to ensure accurate data collection for Canadian Institute for Health Information (CIHI) submissions.

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#### Features

• The DSWG allows the user to access the Discharge Summary Template from a smartphone or computer without the need to be on a hospital network.

#### Requirements

- The application can run on both iPhones and Android Smart Phones. Blackberry OS phones cannot be used.
- You must have a compatible device (iPhone iOS 8 and newer or Android Smartphone OS 4.4 and newer). You can check by doing the following:

# Access

### Step 3: Add it to Home Screen
